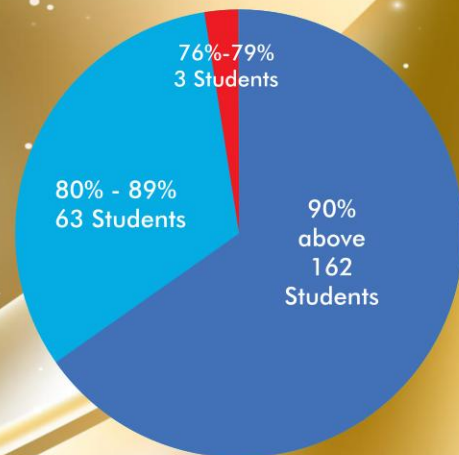

SECONDARY SECTION

Grade VI - Pages in Motion

Grade VIII - The Soliloquy Series

Day 3 witnessed the popular characters of Shakespeare alive as the Grade 8 students presented "The Soliloquy Series." The young actors tackled the intellectual rigors of Shakespearean drama, demonstrating a sophisticated command of "heightened language" and the rhythmic pulse of iambic pentameter. Moving beyond mere recitation, the students achieved a wide emotional range, utilizing nuanced acting to convey the complex internal conflicts and subtext rooted within the Elizabethan psyche. By justifying their character's motivations through rigorous textual evidence, the students proved their ability to analyse classical literature through a lens of psychological depth and performance, bringing the Bard's timeless words to vivid, contemporary life.



Grade VII - A Street Symphony

Day 2 of Literary Week was drum rolled with the vibrant energy of our Grade 7 students as they presented "A Street Symphony," a high-octane showcase that mastered the art of the "Street Play." They showcased remarkable ensemble work, utilizing group coordination and physical theatre to creatively construct rhythmic scenery and props with their own movements. Beyond the technical skills of performance, the exhibition highlighted the students' successful integration of core human values-such as empathy and compassion-into their craft.



Grade IX - The Grand Finale – A Renaissance Revival

The culmination of the literary week was the grand finale, aptly titled "A Renaissance Revival," which served as a magnificent capstone project for the Grade 9 students. This showcase demonstrated their unique ability to curate a multi-dimensional tribute to the 16th century, masterfully blending rigorous historical research with creative artistic flair. During the "Rendezvous" segment, students engaged in sharp conversational improvisation that highlighted their deep historical knowledge, while the fashion show allowed them to display a sophisticated mastery of the symbolic importance of Elizabethan costume design. Throughout the production, the students exhibited significant leadership and maturity, taking full ownership of both the technical execution and the artistic elements of the revival.



SECONDARY SECTION

Active Learning: Units in Physics

The activity on *Fundamental and Derived Units* was successfully conducted in Class IX A. Students were divided into small groups and provided with flash cards containing different units. They were asked to identify and classify each unit as either fundamental or derived. The activity created an engaging learning environment where students actively participated and collaborated with their peers. Through discussion and group interaction, they were able to strengthen their conceptual understanding of the topic.



Rural Governance Made Simple

Students of Grade 6 participated in an activity on “Local Self Government – Rural” aimed at helping them understand the concept of rural governance, including the structure and functions of Panchayati Raj institutions. The session focused on enhancing conceptual clarity through interactive and visual learning methods, encouraging active participation from all students. It enhanced their engagement, strengthened retention of concepts, and increased their awareness of governance at the grassroots level.



Decoding Global Time

Grade 9 students from sections A, B, and C participated in an engaging Geography activity titled “Decoding Global Time.” The activity aimed to simplify concepts like local time, GMT-IST conversion, and the International Date Line. Students used self-made colour-coded circles to visually represent directions, calculations, and date changes, making learning more interactive. They worked collaboratively in groups while solving questions individually to ensure better understanding and accountability. Selected students explained their answers, building confidence and communication skills. The activity encouraged active participation and made complex concepts easier to grasp. Overall, it enhanced conceptual clarity and made learning both effective and enjoyable.

Hands-on Capacitor Activity

The Physics Teacher, Mr. Manmohan conducted an engaging and hands-on activity on the topic “Making of a Capacitor,” where students actively explored the fundamental principles behind capacitors through practical application. Through guided experimentation, they observed and compared the varying intensity of the electrical discharge, deepening their insight into the behavior and functioning of capacitors in a safe and controlled manner.
